POSITIONS AVAILABLE

Research Intern: The Research Intern would support the research and policy programs at the National Council for Research on Women. S/he would help manage correspondence to member centers and other constituencies; contribute to the development of policy briefs and position papers; conduct relevant research on topics of interest to the Council; and help grow our Research Action Groups.

Publications Intern and Archivist: The Publications Intern will maintain inventory of publications, reports, and documents. S/he will assist with outreach regarding publications and sales.

Member Center Relations Intern: The Member Center Relations Intern will assist in managing and cultivating new and existing member center. S/he would be responsible for orientating new members, performing daily research, outreach, and updating Council membership records.

Communications Intern: The Communications Intern would work to enhance our ongoing communication to member center and the general public. S/he would update our website; develop news alerts and bulletins for member center; and work to promote the work of the Council to our network.

Commitment: During the fall semester, interns work a minimum of 10-15 hours per week. When appropriate, the Council will assist interns in arranging for academic or work-study credit.
